**ANDERSON TOWNSHIP PARK DISTRICT
RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING POLICY FOR DISPOSAL OF
UNNEEDED PERSONAL PROPERTY**

WHEREAS, in the course of its operations, the Park District accumulates personal property which has been lost or abandoned by its owners and has remained unclaimed for at least six months; and

WHEREAS, the Park District has no need for such property and wishes to establish a policy for its donation to eligible non-profit organizations; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Park Commissioners of the Anderson Township Park District, County of Hamilton, Ohio:

This Board hereby finds that, as of the date of this resolution, the accumulated property which has been lost or abandoned and has remained unclaimed for at least six months is not needed for public use; and that the fair market value of such property is, in the opinion of the Board, two thousand five hundred dollars or less.

This Board intends to donate such unneeded property to non-profit organizations that are located in Ohio and are exempt from federal income tax pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Secs. 501(a) and (c)(3).

Each lot of unneeded property shall first be offered to Peppermint Pig. The reason for such priority is that Peppermint Pig is an organization that is devoted to animal rescue, and has assisted the Park District in animal-related matters, including assistance at the Park District's Kellogg Dog Park. If Peppermint Pig declines such unneeded property, it shall be offered on a first-come, first-served basis to other qualifying organizations.
