Annual art show features local talent, music, food

The Anderson Park District hosts its fifth annual A Fair of the Arts from noon to 5 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 25, at Beech Acres Park, 6910 Salem Road.

More than 70 artists from the greater Cincinnati area will feature hand-crafted works in stained glass, fine jewelry, pottery, painted furniture, mixed media, photography and more. The Anderson Park District will be selling food and treats, including beer and wine.

Music begins at noon with a one-man acoustic performance, followed by the Greater Anderson Promotes Peace's dedication of its

peace pole at 2 p.m.

The pole, created by Anderson Township resident Joel Selmeier, is a \$59,000 six-sided granite sculpture with six, 20-inch tall monoliths that depict the words "May Peace Prevail on Earth" in 12 different languages.

The keynote speakers scheduled for the event are Racelle Weiman, director of the Center for Holocaust and Humanity Education and Robert Harrod, president and CEO of the National Conference for Community Injustice.
